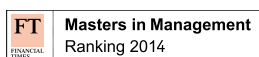

# Study in English while living in France

## STUDYING ABROAD, AN INVALUABLE EXPERIENCE

Studying abroad is an unforgettable experience and adds value to one's degree. Employers will look favourably on an international experience because it enhances students' skills and competences such as managing diversity, communicating in different cultural environments, developing self-awareness and self-confidence, autonomy and initiative.

Studying abroad is also an opportunity to build a new network of friends and contacts from all over the world, which is a major asset in an increasingly inter-dependent world.

## ORIENTATION WEEK BY RENNES SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

Rennes School of Business provides an orientation programme for all international students the week before classes start. Sessions are compulsory and cover application for residence permit, health insurance, Internet provider, mobile phone number, bus pass, as well as sessions on French culture, academic expectations and standards.

## TEACHING METHOD

Students are given a detailed course outline at the beginning of each course (not available beforehand) where the professors provide learning objectives and outcomes ; course description and main topics covered, teaching methods and bibliography, method of assessment.

About 60 - 70 % of the total mark = final examination. The remaining is assessed on individual and / or group presentations, quizzes, case studies, etc. The final examinations always take place during the last 2 or 3 weeks of the semester and are compulsory for all students.

### ECTS / CONTACT HOURS

- 24 – 27 contact hours per course per semester
  - Students can earn between 3 and 6 ECTS per course depending on the programme followed
- 30 ECTS are equivalent to 15 US credits or 60 UK credits*

# Campuses

## RENNES, AN IDEAL STUDY ENVIRONMENT IN THE WESTERN FRANCE

Studying at Rennes School of Business is a wonderful means to discover the richness of French life, its culture and economy.

Rennes School of Business is located in Rennes, the capital city of Brittany, 2 hours from Paris by TGV fast train and 1 hour by plane from London. # How to apply

*Students applying for an exchange with Rennes School of Business must first be nominated by their home institution.*

## TRANSFER CREDIT STUDENT

- Fully completed application form signed by the candidate and the Home University
- Official transcripts for the entire education of the student at the Home University (translated into English if the transcripts are not in English, French, German, Spanish or Italian)
- CV (in English) and statement of purpose (in English)

## COURSE SELECTION

Students will be contacted by email 2 to 3 months before the start of the programme in order to make their choice of courses.

Transfer credit students can register in business courses for a maximum of 30 ECTS: 6 business courses at undergraduate level or 5 business courses at graduate level, double degree seeking students must follow the requirements for the programme on which they are registered.

## DOUBLE DEGREE SEEKING STUDENT

Students may have the opportunity of studying for a double degree (Bachelor or Master level) if a double degree agreement has been signed between the two institutions.

## LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Exchange students:

- A B2 level in English
- A B2 level in French if Business courses taught in French are chosen

Toefl test IBT 79 / IELTS 6.5 / TOEIC 750

# Practical Information

## TRAVEL INSURANCE

Before the students leave their home country, they must make sure that they have taken out travel insurance including repatriation in case of serious health problems, accident, etc.

## HEALTH INSURANCE

All non-European students are required by French law to take out the French Student Health Insurance.

Fee in 2015/2016: € 215. Only students from the European Community are exempt if they can produce a nominative and valid EHIC (European Health Insurance) card for the length of their studies in Rennes.

Private insurance cannot be accepted under any circumstances.

## VISA FOR NON-EUROPEAN STUDENTS

Students should contact the local French Embassy or the nearest CampusFrance agency in their country to obtain a visa application to arrange their stay in France as soon as they are admitted.

## ACCOMMODATION

Rennes School of Business does not have halls of residence on campus. However, the School helps international students find suitable accommodation (student residence, private house, shared flat, homestay family).

Upon acceptance, students will be contacted by the accommodation service via email.

## LIVING IN RENNES

Budget is very personal and depends on students expectations. Living costs come to about 700€/month including accommodation, food, photocopies, insurance, health insurance, public transport excluding travel to and from Rennes, holidays, etc.

## WELCOME INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

“Well’Come” is one of the 25 student unions. It helps international students integrate into the Business School and life in Rennes. Well’Come does not only pick up international students at the station or airport, it also organises tourist trips (Mont St. Michel, Paris, etc.) and sports events with French and international students.

<b>Language requirement</b>	<p>✓ <b>Students on transfer credit:</b></p> <p>The level of English is left up to evaluation of the home university (we ask the home institution to provide a certificate confirming a B2 level in English – or equivalent TOEFL, which is sufficient to take classes at ESC Rennes). All or most classes are conducted in English, therefore students are expected to have a sufficient command of the English language to be capable of understanding, making oral presentations, writing reports and exams etc.</p> <p>✓ <b>Students on double Degree:</b></p> <p>English language test required (except for native English speakers): TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS (TOEFL: IBT = 79, computer based = 213, paper based = 550; TOEIC = 750; IELTS = 6.5 depending on the programme).</p> <p>No French test required (unless electives in French are chosen, a B2 level in French will be necessary).</p>

<b>Housing</b>	<p>✓ As most campuses in France, ESC Rennes School of Business does not have halls of residence and therefore all students registered at the school must rent private accommodation. The school and the “<b>Well’Come</b>” team can help students, if they wish, find accommodation for the duration of their stay in Rennes.</p> <p>✓ Accommodation in Rennes needs planning and reserving in advance as it is a university city with over 60,000 French and international students every year. Rents can vary depending on the landlord, the location and the services and equipment provided. Students <b>are therefore strongly encouraged</b> to reserve their accommodation as soon as possible after having been accepted.</p>
<b>Insurance</b>	<p>✓ <b>Travel insurance</b></p> <p>Before the students leave their country, they must make sure that they have taken out travel insurance with repatriation in case of serious health problems, accident etc.</p> <p><i>NB: Students who must apply for visas are often asked to take out repatriation and other insurances by the French Embassy.</i></p> <p>✓ <b>Health insurance</b></p> <p>All students are required by French law to take out the French Student Health Insurance (fees for 2015/2016: 215€). Only students from the European Community are exempt <b>IF</b> they can produce a nominative and valid EHIC card (European Health Insurance Card) for the length of their studies in Rennes.</p> <p>Private insurance cannot be accepted under any circumstances.</p> <p>It is illegal for students to attend French universities if they do not have the above mentioned Health Insurance.</p> <p>✓ <b>Accommodation insurance</b></p> <p>French law stipulates that all persons who rent accommodation must have civil responsibility and third party insurance at their address in France; some property owners include this in their «rental package». If not, the students can buy this with their French bank.</p>
<b>Visa</b>	<p>All students living in a non-European country will have to apply for a visa. Please check with you nearest CampusFrance agency, French Embassy or Consulate.</p> <p>✓ <b>Only for students with a Visa with “ETUDIANT” written on it:</b> The OFII form will enable the students to travel in the Schengen-member countries and will entitle them to the housing allowance. If they do not go through this formality, they may not be able to re-enter France in the future.</p> <p>✓ Upon acceptance at ESC Rennes School of Business the students will receive the official acceptance letter in English, its translation into French (for visa purposes) and an additional letter in French for the Embassy / CampusFrance agency.</p>

<b>Welcome on arrival</b>	The <b>Well'Come</b> team is a student organisation which welcomes international students and helps them integrate into the school and everyday life at Rennes. The Well'Come team not only provides a pick-up service to collect the students from Rennes train/bus stations or airport, and helps them settle into their accommodation, but it also organises parties, tourist trips (Mont St. Michel, Paris, etc.,) and sports events with French students.
